Downtown Street Restrictions

The following streets will be closed to non-emergency vehicles during the stated times. Turn off your GPS device, because it will not account for Super Bowl street restrictions!

Park and Ride

Purchase advance space for \$2 per person; limited onsite availability \$10 per car.

Capitol Avenue

- Closed from Maryland Street to South Street starting [January 19, 2012](#). Access to the Plaza Park Garage on Capitol Avenue will be available throughout the event.
- Capitol Avenue begins transitioning to fewer available lanes from Ohio Street to Maryland Street starting January 19, 2012.
- Closed from South Street to McCarty Street starting [January 28, 2012 to February 6, 2012](#).

Illinois Street (North of Georgia Street)

- Lane restrictions begin on [January 21, 2012](#).
- Closed from Georgia Street to Maryland Street except for exiting traffic from the World of Wonders Parking Garage starting on January 27, 2012.
- Will reopen to traffic in the afternoon of February 8, 2012.

Illinois Street (South of Georgia Street)

- Lane restrictions begin on [January 21, 2012](#) transitioning to fewer lanes Northbound from the interstate to Georgia Street.
- Closed from Louisiana Street to Georgia Street starting [January 27, 2012](#).
- Two-way traffic from South Street to Louisiana Street starting January 27, 2012 providing access to Pan Am Garage, Crowne Plaza, and the Omni Hotel.
- Will reopen to traffic in the afternoon of February 8, 2012.
- Closed from McCarty Street to South Street on Super Bowl Sunday only, [February 5, 2012](#).
- Full size motor coaches or oversize vehicles will not be permitted west of Meridian Street from January 27, 2012 to February 8, 2012. All motor coaches and stretch limousines will be directed South on Meridian at South Street to McCarty Street and the Super or Bowl Routes.

Meridian Street (North of Georgia Street)

- Lane restrictions begin on [January 21, 2012](#), with the closure of southbound Meridian from Maryland to Georgia Street.
- Northbound closed from Georgia Street to Maryland Street on [January 27, 2012](#).
- Meridian north of Georgia Street will reopen to traffic in the afternoon of February 8, 2012.

Meridian Street (South of Georgia Street)

- Lane restrictions begin on [January 23, 2012](#).
- Closed from Georgia Street to Louisiana Street starting [January 27, 2012](#).
- Will reopen to traffic in the afternoon of February 8, 2012.
- Full size motor coaches or oversize vehicles will not be permitted west of Meridian Street from January 27, 2012 to February 8, 2012. All motor coaches and stretch limousines will be directed South on Meridian at South Street to McCarty Street and the Super or Bowl Routes.

Monument Circle (Southern Half) and Meridian Street

- Closed from Washington Street to Monument Circle on [January 27, 2012 to January 29, 2012](#).
- Closed from Washington Street to Monument Circle on [February 3, 2012](#) to [February 5, 2012](#).

Market Street (west of Monument Circle)

- Closed to eastbound traffic on the Westside of Monument Circle around the southern half to Pennsylvania Street from [January 27, 2012 to January 29, 2012](#) and from [February 3, 2012](#) to [February 5, 2012](#).

Pennsylvania Street

- Lane restrictions begin on [January 23, 2012](#).

- Closed from Maryland Street to South Street starting [January 27, 2012](#) except for CSX employee parking access.
- Will reopen to traffic in the afternoon of February 6, 2012.

Georgia Street (Capitol Avenue to Illinois Street)

- Closed from Capitol Avenue to Illinois Street starting [January 19, 2012](#).
- Will reopen to all traffic on February 10, 2012.

Georgia Street (Illinois Street to Meridian Street)

- Closed from Illinois Street to Meridian Street eastbound starting [January 21, 2012](#).
- Closed from Illinois Street to Meridian Street westbound starting [January 27, 2012](#).
- Will reopen to traffic in the afternoon of February 8, 2012.

Georgia Street (Meridian Street to Pennsylvania Street)

- Eastbound closed on [January 23, 2012](#).
- Westbound closed on [January 27, 2012](#).
- Will reopen to traffic in the afternoon of February 8, 2012.

South Street

- Lane restrictions from Missouri Street to Capitol Avenue starting [January 19, 2012](#).
- Closed from Missouri Street to Capitol Avenue starting January 22, 2012 through February 13, 2012.
- Closed from West Street to Illinois Street on Super Bowl Sunday only, [February 5, 2012](#).
- Will begin opening to traffic in the afternoon of February 6, 2012 and will be completely open by February 17, 2012.

Missouri Street (Closed Super Bowl Weekend only)

- Closed from McCarty Street to South Street starting the late morning on [February 3, 2012](#).
- Closed from McCarty to Maryland on Super Bowl Sunday February 5, 2012.
- Will reopen to traffic on the afternoon of February 6, 2012.

Merrill Street

- Closed from Capitol Avenue to Illinois Street starting on [February 3, 2012](#) and will reopen to traffic in the afternoon of February 6, 2012.

- For advanced reservations, the cost is \$2.00 per person to park and ride the roundtrip shuttle. Children under 2 years old are free.

Parking for ticket holders to Super Bowl Sunday, February 5, 2012

- The NFL has secured multiple parking garages and lots for ticketholders attending Super Bowl XLVI on Sunday, February 5, 2012.
- There will be no re-entry allowed in official Super Bowl XLVI parking lots or garages. Tailgating, tents, grills, and game activities are prohibited in vehicle or pedestrian thoroughfares.

Parking for Downtown Workers

Parking for Super Bowl Volunteers January 27, 2012 through February 4, 2012 - Follow the parking directions provided in your Volunteer Team Handbook and Training for your specific position.

- All Super Bowl Host Committee volunteers will receive free parking during the shift times you are working. Parking arrangements vary for each volunteer position.
- Parking has been secured at the Indianapolis Zoo for most Volunteers working in or near downtown Indianapolis.
- A shuttle will operate from the Zoo to a drop-off location at the corner of Washington Street and Capitol Avenue adjacent to the Indiana State Capitol and just a block from the Indiana Convention Center, the venue for the NFL Experience.
- The shuttle will operate from January 27, 2012 - February 4, 2012 from 6:00 a.m.-12:30 a.m.
- Park at the Zoo only when serving your volunteer shifts. Your volunteer credential and uniform are required for shuttle access.
- For volunteer questions contact your management team or Volunteer Headquarters at 317-638-3287.
- Feel free to ride IndyGo, carpool or have someone drop you off and pick you up at the conclusion of your shift if you wish.

Parking for Super Bowl Volunteers on Super Bowl Sunday, February 5, 2012.

- Volunteer parking and shuttle plans change for Super Bowl Sunday. There is no parking available at the zoo.
- If you are assigned a Sunday shift, follow the parking instructions provided at Volunteer Team Training.

Parking lots include

- Parking has been secured at the Virginia Avenue Garage (100 Virginia Avenue) for volunteers working downtown but not in the Indiana Convention Center or Lucas Oil Stadium on Super Bowl Sunday.
- The garage will be open from 6:00 a.m. to 3:00 a.m. parking passes will be given during uniform distribution in January at Mayer Chapel for those permitted to park on Super Bowl Sunday.
- Parking has been secured at the Old Indianapolis International Airport ONLY for Staff and Volunteers who will be working within the secured perimeter (Indiana Convention Center and Lucas Oil Stadium) on Super Bowl Sunday.
- The parking lot will be open at 4:30 a.m. with shuttle buses running from Sunday, February 5, 2012 at 5 a.m. to Monday, February 6, 2012 at 10:30 a.m.
- A shuttle will run from the airport and drop off at the State Capitol Building at the corner of Washington Street and Capitol Avenue.
- Game Day credentials will be issued in the Indiana Convention Center.
- It is recommended that you park 90 minutes prior to your shift. After receiving a Game Day credential, volunteers will not be allowed to leave the secured perimeter until after their volunteer shift.
- After your shift, walk through the Indiana Convention Center, Hall K (to the east of the building), exit onto Capitol Ave and walk north back to the bus load zone at the corner of Washington Street and Capitol Avenue.

On November 1, 2011, "Kids Against Hunger" held their Million Meal Marathon from 7:00 a.m.-7:00 p.m. at Lucas Oil Stadium. This event provided an opportunity for people all over Indianapolis, including City Officials, celebrities and the Indianapolis Colts to help fill meal packages for starving children all across the globe.

This was a team event with Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department being asked to join in the celebration of volunteerism by participating with a group called "Team Joey". Officer Brian Swingle stepped up to the challenge and organized IMPD officers to volunteer for this worthy cause. His goal was to recruit approximately 50 volunteers. Although he did not reach the projected goal, he was able to obtain a significant police presence for this event.

"Team Joey" was created by the family and friends of Joey Keller, the young boy who was stricken by cancer and designated as an Honorary Deputy Chief last summer during a longevity ceremony. Joey was doing well at the time of this event. His desire was to find a way to give back to the community in the same way that his community rallied around him during many grueling hours of treatment. Once Joey gave the go-ahead for the participation of "Team Joey" for the Million Meal Marathon, he made this quote: "Team Joey has gotten me through a very difficult time in my life. What a motivated and caring group of people. During my cancer treatment and surgeries, I had to go through many hours without eating and understanding the sting of hunger. I hope you will join me in this special cause."

Over 500,000 meals were packed to feed the needy. 140, 000 of that number will stay in Central Indiana. Officer Swingle is to be commended for volunteering his time and organizing a police presence at this event which truly was a success by all accounts. It is for these reasons I am pleased to recognize Officer Brian Swingle as the DT District Officer of the Month for November 2011.

10 Quick Security Tips

1. Keep all doors and windows closed and securely fastened. An open window or door is an open invitation for burglars. Thieves are also quick to spot weak locks that may be easily forced open. Doors should have deadbolt locks with a one inch throw and reinforced strike plate with three inch screws. All windows should have window locks.
2. Secure sliding glass doors. Place a metal rod or piece of plywood in the track and install vertical bolts. These will help prevent burglars from forcing the door open or lifting it off the track.
3. Always lock the door to an attached garage. Don't rely on your automatic garage door opener for security.
4. Create the illusion that you are home. By using timers on lights, radios and TV's. Making your residence appear occupied, even when no one is home, will deter criminals.
5. Keep the perimeter of your home well lighted. Installing low voltage outdoor lighting is a cost-effective way to discourage intruders, as well as highlight a house.
6. Never leave clues that you are away on a trip. Have a trusted neighbor collect mail and newspapers while you are away so delivered items do not accumulate. You can also ask a neighbor to park in your driveway or parking place to make it appear that you are present.
7. Keep some shades and blinds up and curtains open to maintain a normal, everyday appearance in your residence.
8. Never leave a message on your telephone answering machine telling people that you are away from home. A message that you will return at a certain time leaves your home vulnerable in the interim.
9. Keep shrubbery trimmed away from entrances and walkways. While large, ornate hedges may be beautiful, they also provide a hiding place for burglars who need only a minute to break in through a window or door.
10. Organize a community watch program to protect your neighborhood.

Fear of retaliation. 2. Just do not want to get involved 3. Do not want an officer to come to my door. I have discussed in past that anyone can remain ANONYMOUS. At the beginning of call tell the dispatcher that you wish to remain anonymous and no information will be broadcast. You will not get an officer at your door. As for involvement, you are involved in a sense because this is your community and neighborhood. The police cannot be everywhere.
