March Officer of the Month
Officer William Payne**



On April 6, 2011 in the early hours of the night officer William Payne was proactively patrolling his assigned beat. Upon turning down an alleyway in the 800 block of Massachusetts Avenue he observed a male subject dressed in all dark clothing holding a backpack standing next to a closed business. He also observed heavy pry marks causing damage to the door of that business, a claw hammer lying on the ground next to the business and a bicycle propped against the business near the back door.

When the male subject saw Officer Payne, he immediately fled on foot while holding a backpack storage bag. Officer Payne broadcasted the suspect's physical description by radio and provided the suspect's direction of travel. Subsequently, a perimeter was established and Officer Payne provided the K9 officer with the suspect's escape route. Two bags, including a backpack, were located within the perimeter and the bags contained numerous items such as; gloves, change of clothes, and a bicycle lock. Upon capture, the suspect had a pair of gloves and a stocking hat which had been altered into a ski mask on his person.

Officer Payne has demonstrated the professionalism that his fellow officers and the community deserve on a routine basis. He actively patrols his beat at all hours of the night. He has provided the City of Indianapolis with over twenty years of dedicated police service. This shows what a highly motivated veteran officer can accomplish when pro-actively protecting the city!

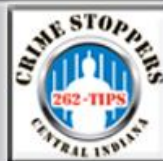

2 Construction Projects

Indiana Avenue Apartments, 825 Indiana Avenue, 4-story mid-rise (houses elderly and disabled only)

Starting today at 10 p.m. an accelerated elevator renovation will begin running 24 hours a day for at least 10 days. The building has 2 wings. The elevator on the "A" side will be taken down, so no elevator will be available for residents or emergency responders in the "A" wing. The elevators in the "B" wing (there are 2) will remain operational and will be unaffected. We will have an off-duty police officer and/or a PSSO working in the building every day during renovation from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. The agency has relocated tenants to hotels who are disabled and/or have limited mobility. This project is expected to be completed no later than June 17th after inspection by the state. The tenants are very aware of this project.

Lugar Tower Apartments, 901 Fort Wayne Avenue, 15-story high-rise

In about two weeks the entrance/exit from Fort Wayne Avenue will be closed for several months for site preparation. The development is under-going a \$30 million dollar renovation that includes the construction of new buildings that will face Fort Wayne Avenue when completed. The rear entrance being 9th Street (and the only other entrance to the building) off of East Street (runs one-way south) will be the only vehicular entry/exit point. The current front entrance into the lobby of the building will remain open. There will also be significant rehabilitation occurring inside the existing building. This project will probably take up to 2 years to complete. As soon as I get more information about an exact date and what the plans are to relocate tenant vehicles I will pass it on.

Fear of retaliation. 2. Just do not want to get involved 3. Do not want an officer to come to my door. I have discussed in past that anyone can remain ANONYMOUS. At the beginning of call tell the dispatcher that you wish to remain anonymous and no information will be broadcast. You will not get an officer at your door. As for involvement, you are involved in a sense because this is your community and neighborhood. The police cannot be everywhere.
