Downtown District officers provide uniformed field patrol and investigative services to the downtown Indianapolis area. The district's roll call facility is located at the Historic Union Station, 39 West Jackson Place and is staffed with 87 sworn and 2 civilian employees. The district covers approximately four square miles with a 2000 population estimate of 16,000. Daily commuters, sports, and other special events can swell the number of citizens on the district to 250,000 or more.

Downtown District relies heavily on manpower provided by officers assigned not only to patrol vehicles, but also bicycle and foot patrol officers. Working closely with downtown citizens and businesses, IMPD Downtown District officers work diligently to keep the downtown area a great place to live, work and visit.

## **AUGUST OFFICER OF THE MONTH**

### **OFFICER EMANUEL R. TOLIVER**

On Tuesday, 8/21/12 at approximately 1845 hours Officer Emanuel Toliver received a dispatched run, domestic disturbance, at 300 N. Illinois Street. Upon his arrival, he located a female, Sabrina Jefferson, who stated that her baby's father had shoved her and taken their baby. The father, James Clenna, had fled the area with the baby. Ms. Jefferson was very distraught and had bruises and small abrasions around her left eye. Officer Toliver immediately provided a suspect description and direction of travel to the control operator. He then directed his attention towards Ms. Jefferson in an attempt to calm and console her. Captain David Allender promptly arrived on the scene and began coordinating a perimeter with the available police units involved in the search of the suspect. After several minutes of searching for suspect James Clenna, he returned to the scene on his own. Officer Toliver believes the suspect was probably coaxed back to the scene primarily due to the high number of police units on the perimeter and believing the female was alone. When the suspect observed Officer Toliver, he tensed up as if he was preparing to run with baby in-hand. Officer Toliver greeted suspect Clenna warmly as he attempted to relax him and give the impression that he was not a suspect in order to entice him back. Officer Toliver maintained a non-threatening posture and kept reassuring the suspect that everything was ok.

Once within Officer Toliver's reach, the suspect was promptly handcuffed and arrested. Officer Toliver used great poise and a cool head in order to bring the incident to a swift and nonviolent conclusion. Due to the quick and steady actions of Officer Toliver and Captain Allender the incident ended quickly and without additional physical confrontation. Both officers should be commended for their professionalism, their passion to serve the public, and their dedication to protect those involved in domestic violence. They serve as role models to their fellow law enforcement officers.

It is for these reasons Officer Emanuel Toliver is being recognized as the Downtown District Officer of the Month for August 2012.

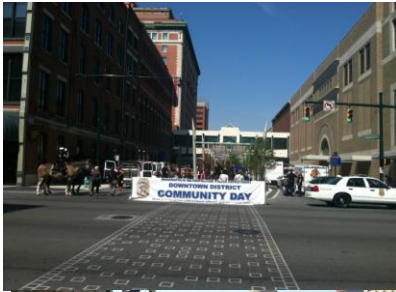
