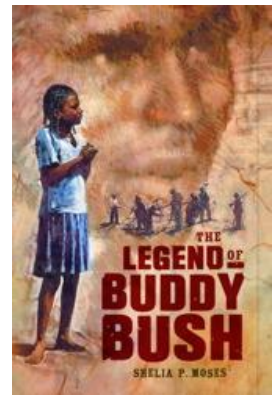
### *Young Writer's Workshop with Author Sheila Moses*
